Parking will be very limited on Monday, May 12 due to Commencement activities. You will be asked to provide your reunion parking pass, or a state-issued accessibility placard or license plate, before entering the Danforth University Center (DUC) Garage. You should have received your reunion parking pass in your confirmation materials. You can also ask for one at the registration tables for any of our signature events.

The accessible drop-off is available in the lot in front of Simon Hall. Accessible parking and drop-off can only be accessed via Forsyth Boulevard and Olympian Way.


